NEUROPATHIC DISEASE

Neuropathic skin disorders are often used as the “the catch all” for chronic long term skin conditions that no-one has been able to diagnose or resolve and so the dog is effectively diagnosed as “neurotic”. Sometimes, this is true!

Classic Example: Acral lick dermatitis, Lick Granuloma or canine neurodermatitis
